Reception have participated in their first PE session this week. They impressed the adults with how well they listened and negotiated the space in the hall in order to be able to travel safely. They also had their first Write Dance sessions. They listened to the volcano music and learnt moves to match all segments of it. After practising this they finished the week by making marks to the music using crayons and large paper. They thought carefully about the movements their arms and wrists should make at different points in the music.

Our Jigsaw PSHE session this week was about emotions. The children are becoming more confident to talk to each other and in front of their peers. This week they shared times when they had felt happy, sad and angry and what they can do if they are feeling that way.

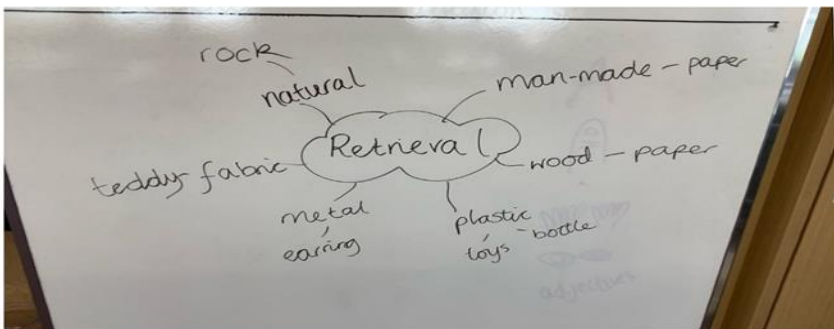
In year 2, we have been enjoying being scientists and investigating the uses of everyday materials.

L.O.To investigate everyday materials and their uses.

We started our lesson by retrieving what we learnt in yr1 about materials. Then we used our scientific enquiry skills to ask questions,give possible answers and explore the everyday materials at each station. We discuss what the materials the objects were made from , how they were the same,different and why they were chosen for that particular object. At the end of the lesson, we sorted the materials into groups as a yr1 recap skill.



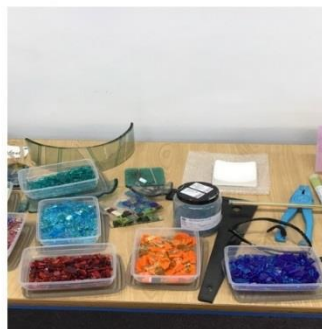
Wednesday 21st September 2022
We investigated changing the shape of materials by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.
We talked about why they could change shape and talked about which materials could not change shape easily.



Wednesday 22nd September 2022

L.O.To understand how glass as an everyday material can change shape and be manipulated.

Today, a local fused glass artist came to school to talk to us about how glass is made, manipulated and used to create art. We discovered how glass needs to be heated in a furnace at a high temperature in order to change its shape and how different artists use glass in different ways.

The Redruth Mining and Pasty Day – Bite-sized!

The Mining & Pasty Festival has been rescheduled to Saturday 1st October to coincide with the town's regular monthly market day and the Fun Palaces Weekend. The original Festival was due to start the day after the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and had to be cancelled following guidance from the National Association of Local Councils.

We (Redruth Town Council) have been able to reschedule some parts of the original festival to Saturday 1st October so that the town doesn't completely miss out on its celebrations this year.

Starting from 10am, visitors will be able to enter their home-made pasties into the Great Cornish Pasty Off with a special category for chefs aged under 18. There will also be competitions for Best Crafty Pasty, Best Woolly Pasty and Best Pasty Costume. Prizes such as a collectors' edition t-shirt and Rowe's vouchers will be awarded to the winners.

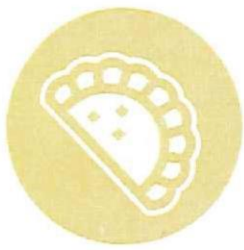
The day continues with a calendar filled with live music, food, stalls, pasty trails and competitions, a Miners Tribute walk, workshops and demos.

- Live music throughout town

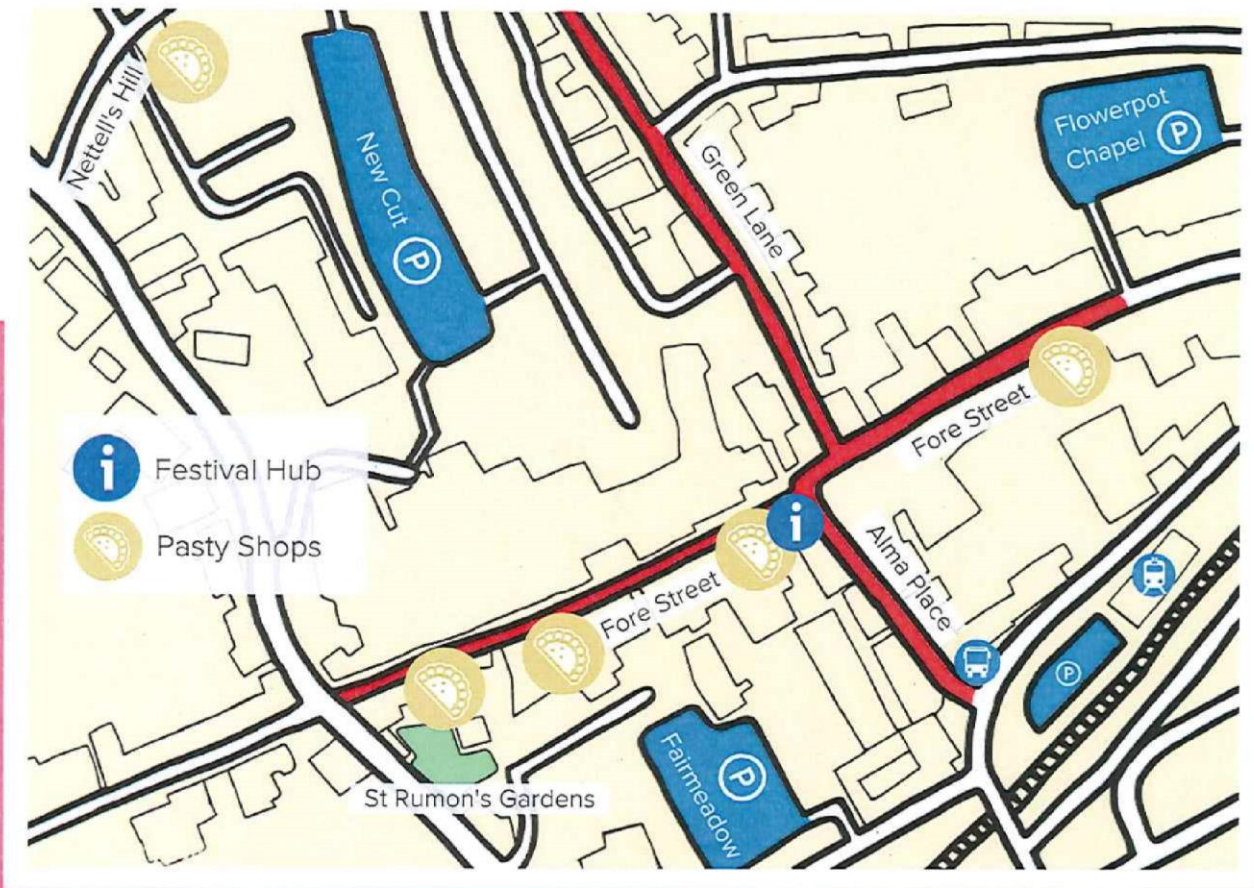

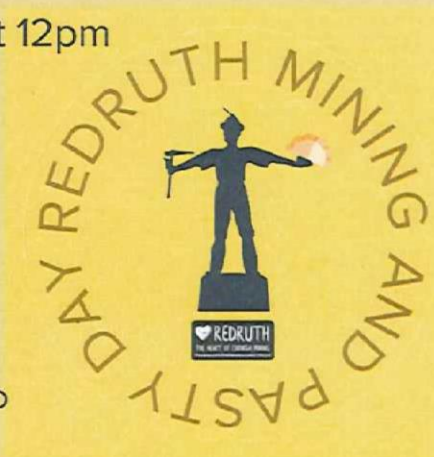
