This week in the Nursery we have started exploring the magic colours and practising using our fingers to squeeze the pipettes. The children also used their fingers to pick up small items such as sequins to make some new bottle babies for our outdoor area. Our pumpkins have now moved into the large tray and are being used as an accompaniment for our gloop play which the children have had great enjoyment from.



This week in Reception the children have read the story Small's Big Dream by Manjeet Mann. They have been thinking about the dreams they might have for the future, especially thinking about what they might like to be when they are an adult and what it might take to turn their dreams into a reality.

The children also took part in their first reception Healthy Movers session. They listened to How to Catch a Star by Oliver Jeffers and then had to stand, balanced on a spot, and reach up, crouch low and jump up in a controlled manner to 'catch a star'. They also had to pass an object around their bodies to practise crossing their mid-line. They loved taking part. In their life skills lesson they have been practising how to put their coat on and zip it up independently. Adults have been very impressed with how well the children have learnt how to do this and are now trying their best to do this for themselves.

The maths this week has centred on a fun five frame rocket game. The children have rolled a 1,2,3 dice to find out how many counters to put on, taking turns with a friend. They have had to work out how many spaces they had on their five frame and what number they would need to roll to fill their frame and become the winner.






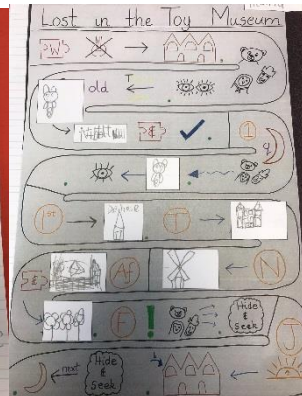

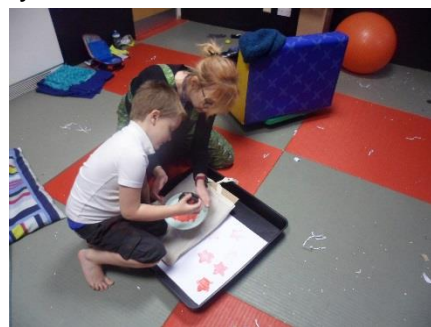

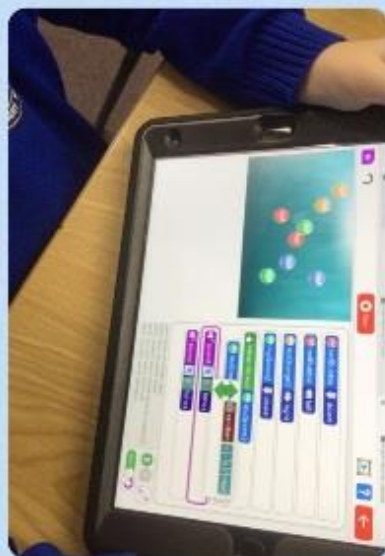
