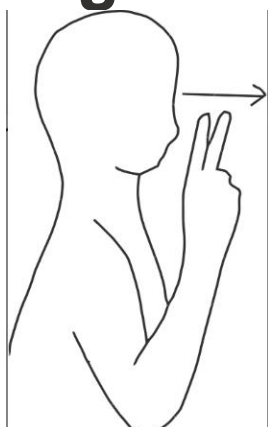
### Cornish Word of the Week

This week in the nursery we have been celebrating World Nursery Rhyme Week. The children are singing and signing our five focus rhymes fantastically. The Big Ship Sails, 1,2,3,4,5 Once I Caught a Fish Alive, BINGO, Five Little Speckled Frogs and Twinkle Twinkle Little Star. They have been using props to accompany the rhymes, singing and moving in the hall and singing outside. What a great week in the nursery.



The Reception children have been completing astronaut challenges this week! They have found out how astronauts travel into space, the different parts of a rocket and they have designed and made their own rocket. They also found out that animals have been sent into space too. They had to complete the puzzles to find out more. In our second Get Cycling session the children used two legs to push off and glide with their feet off the floor. They also used the brakes to stop and the handlebars to turn the bike around. In our Life Skills session we mastered turning our jumpers and cardigans the right way around and putting it on. They were also able to give their friends clear instructions on how to put theirs on independently.



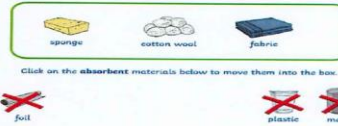


This week in Year 1, we have learnt how to test whether materials were –
