This week in the Nursery we have been taking part in British Science Week and having fun with different experiments including; a cola volcano, rocket balloon, magnets and a skittles rainbow. The children have also been busy baking Cornish heavy cake.



This week Reception have been developing their artistic skills. They have learnt about Terry Frost and Patrick Heron, two Cornish artists who like to use shape in their creations. In maths we have been learning about and creating our own repeating patterns so the children have combined the two and created repeated pattern shape artwork based on the Cornish artist's work. We also looked at what happens when we mix colours using oil pastels. We predicted what might happen from our previous learning about the magic colours. We smudged them with our fingers to mix the colours.

In our wet and windy Wild Tribe lessons this week we developed our butterfly garden further by planting some seeds which will hopefully grow into butterfly friendly flowers in the summer. In our life skills lesson we learnt about keeping our teeth clean, practising what we had learnt on our pretend sets of teeth afterwards!



This week in Year 1 the children have been using clay in art to experiment making marks with different objects to add texture. These skills will come in really useful for some more clay work that we have planned for next term.



On Tuesday, year 2 went on an incredible trip to the Eden Project. We investigated the biomes and particularly loved walking across the rope bridge in the rainforest biome! The children spotted plants from the continents that we have learned about in geography and marvelled at how tall the plants were. In our workshop, we dissected a bean to find the radicle (baby root) and planted our own seed to take home. The children were so brilliantly behaved and had an amazing time. Thank you to all of our parent volunteers - we couldn't have done it without you!



Cornish Word of the Week


