Class 9 – South Crofty	Oliver for his incredible storytelling and his confidence.	The whole of Class 9 for being very kind to Mrs Clarke.

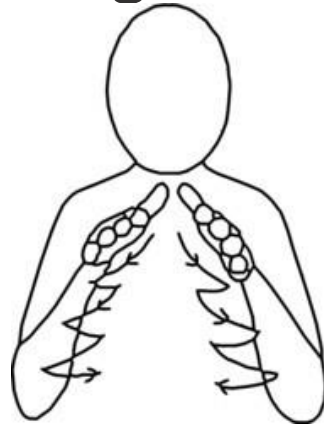
# Cornish Word of the Week

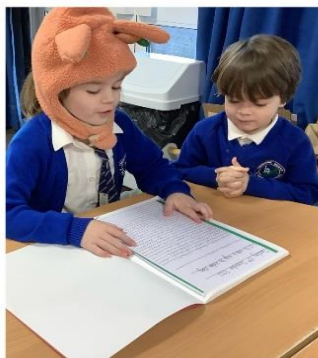
