

Cornish Word of the Week





Supporting parents and children emotionally

SPACE is a new free programme for any parent or carer who wants to better understand and support their children's emotions, as well as their own.

All Working Together, Improving Road safety at Trewirgie Infants.

Dear parent(s)/guardians, your Local Neighbourhood Policing Team have been working in partnership with Trewirgie Infants' School, to improve

road safety at drop off and pick times, not only in the absence of a school crossing patrol, but in the future once the current vacancy has been filled. One of the key areas identified as requiring attention is the 'NO STOPPING' zig zag markings, at the crossing point, outside the main school gates.

Police were on site and observing parking outside the school during the lead up to the Christmas break. This was to access parking and offer advice where contraventions of the 'NO STOPPING' area were witnessed. This is area is to allow children and parents to cross the road safely, provide a good extended view prior to and whilst crossing and allow the school crossing patrol to work safely and primarily, to reduce the risk of a children/pedestrian coming into collision with a vehicle(s).

During monitoring, the following was witnessed by police, vehicles parked within the 'NO STOPPING' area, drivers stopping briefly at the kerb side to allow passengers to alight, last and most concerning, stopping in the middle of the road whilst children/passengers rush out of vehicle to or from the school gate. There is a risk of serious injury to a child or passenger with this type of manoeuvre, it's not only reckless but also dangerous. No one should be rushing when in/crossing the road or alighting from a vehicle, especially children.

During the visits it was encouraging to see the majority of parents park sensibly or walk. It is a minority, that continually fail to fully consider how their driving and parking impacts road safety around the school. Having had a period of engagement, monitoring and this letter, requesting your help to improve the children's road safety at the school, as a policing team, from this point on we will now deal with contraventions by way of a fixed penalty notice.

<u>UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCE</u>, park, drop off, stop, <u>unless directed to so by the school crossing patrol or whilst</u> <u>complying with the highway code to give way, within the zig zag 'NO STOPPING AREA'.</u> Please Park considerately around other areas close to the school, in particularly the junctions at **Trewirgie Hill** where you turn into the school and **Gilly Fields with Trewirgie Hill**, so as not to cause unnecessary or dangerous obstructions, which are also fixed penalty notice offences and will be enforced.

Together we can make the roads around the school safer for the children. We look forward to seeing you all in the new term. Thanking you in advance for your cooperation, a happy New Year to you all.
