Dear Trewirgie Infants' parents and carers,

Punctuality plays a significant role in your child's educational journey, and here are some key reasons why:

Academic success - being on time for school allows your child to start the day with a clear mind and ready to learn. Late arrivals can result in missed instructions, which may hinder their academic progress.

Establishing good habits: Punctuality is a life skill that extends beyond the classroom. Teaching your child to be punctual now sets the foundation for responsible time management in the future.

Please note that if a school is oversubscribed the fact that a child attends a school's nursery or pre-school, or a local nursery or pre-school, does not automatically guarantee a place at that school.
