Famous Physical Features of Zambia



High Land (Plateau)
Most of Zambia is high, flat land. It's not a mountain, but it's higher than sea level.



Victoria Falls
One of the biggest waterfalls in the world. The spray looks like smoke and can create rainbows.

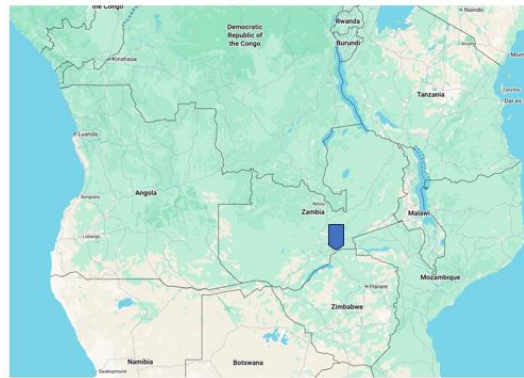
Big Lakes (like Lake Tanganyika)
Zambia has very large lakes where people fish and animals drink.



Zambezi River
A huge river that flows through Zambia. Lots of animals live near it.



Muchinga Mountains
A long line of mountains in the north of Zambia.



Famous Human Features of Zambia



Victoria Falls Bridge
A tall, strong bridge built across the Zambezi River near Victoria Falls. It links Zambia and Zimbabwe. People walk, drive, and even bungee jump from it!

Lake Kariba & The Kariba Dam
This is a man-made lake. People built a huge wall (a dam) across the Zambezi River. This made one of the biggest man-made lakes in the world. Boats, fish, and wildlife all use it.

The Dam also helps make electricity for Zambia and Zimbabwe.



The Copperbelt Mines
Huge mines dug by people to collect copper from underground. The Copperbelt is famous around the world for its minerals.



Tazara Railway
A long railway built by people to help trains travel from Zambia to Tanzania. It helps move goods and people across the country.
