### **Cornish Word of the Week**



This week in the Nursery we have been taking part in National Storytelling Week. We have been telling stories, using our puppet theatre, creating our own stories and acting them out on our stage. We have also been exploring bubbles this week, creating our own bubbles and making foam together using an electric whisk.



The children in Reception have been Go Geographers this week. They have explored the school grounds, hunting for clues left by the gingerbread man. They have studied an aerial photograph of the school and identified features on it. They have also created messy maps of familiar settings and journeys. In maths the children have been using the part whole model to look at different ways we can partition 5 counters and how we can record this more formally.

We enjoyed another visit to the Wild Tribe area too, learning the Zip Zap game and searching for objects we thought were special and interesting.






