# Key songs and rhymes we will be learning

### Maths

We are developing our noticing skills every day, subitising amounts to 5. Subitising is seeing amounts without counting them first. The children use arrangements of dots as well as resources and real life images to hone their subitising skills.

We are also practising how to write each digit from 0-9

We will be looking at 2D and 3D shapes and creating space pictures with these.

We will be using language linked to measuring distance and length – long, short, far, near, metres, ruler, metre stick, tape measure – and finding ways to measure the distance a rocket has travelled.

## Ways to support at home

Use arrangements of things at home (toys, food, natural objects you see on a walk) and ask your child what they can see and what they notice. Can they subitise without counting the objects?

Use the Read Write Inc sound book to practise saying, reading and writing the sounds we are learning in school.

Talk to your child about the vocabulary they have learnt in Drawing Club – can they remember the action that goes with each one?
