This week in the Nursery we have been enjoying exploring floating, sinking and rolling with our apples. We have also been practising our chopping skills to make some stewed apples. There was even a birthday party held in the kitchen with play dough cakes. The children have also been introduced to the sticking board where a range of resources can get stuck using our white glue.



Reception have had such an exciting week this week!

The Little Red Hen left them a note and a map to help them to find ingredients to make their own bread. They learnt that yeast helps the bread to rise. Later in the week she asked us to set up an experiment to see how much yeast, sugar and water would be needed to blow up a balloon! They found out that by putting three spoons of yeast, sugar and warm water into a bottle the balloon would inflate the most. It was so exciting to see the balloons inflating as we watched them throughout the afternoon! We have also been talking about our homes and what they are like. We have been comparing them and also looking at homes animals have to keep them safe.







This week in Year 1 the children have been learning about their place in the world in Geography. They started by learning to draw objects from above and how this is called an aerial or bird's eye view. Then they drew some signpost maps of themselves in the classroom and some people did their home too. Then they learnt how to draw a key and make a map of the classroom. Children in receipt of Pupil Premium will be charged £1.75 per week Clubs are paid in advance when your place has been confirmed. If your child is not allocated a place they will be added to the waiting list for the following ½ term.

In **England** children are entitled to free schools meals if they are in full-time education and they – or their parents – directly receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit (household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax and not including additional benefits)

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain so until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on March 31, 2023.

All children in reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in state-funded schools can also receive a free meal in England.

If you think you may be entitled to free school meals (Pupil Premium) please follow this link Apply for free school meals and pupil premium - Cornwall Council to apply.

If your child is eligible they will have half price trips and clubs while they attend Trewirgie Infants' School.
