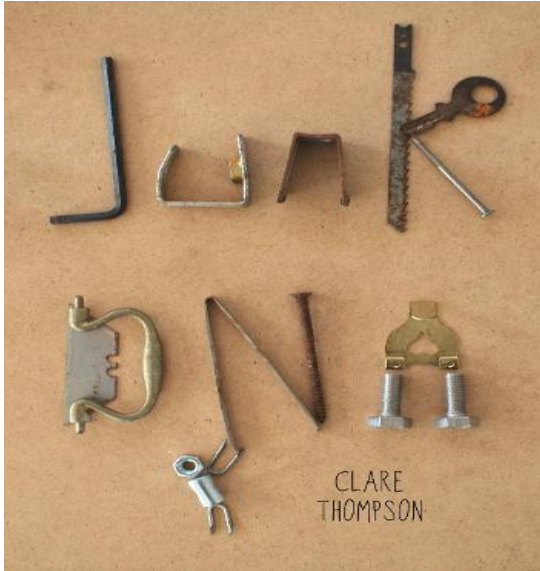

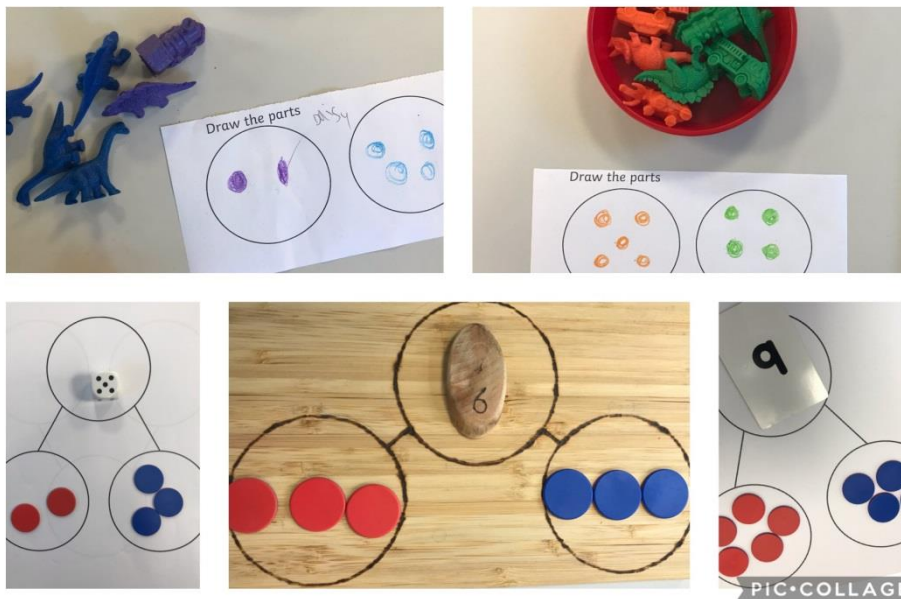
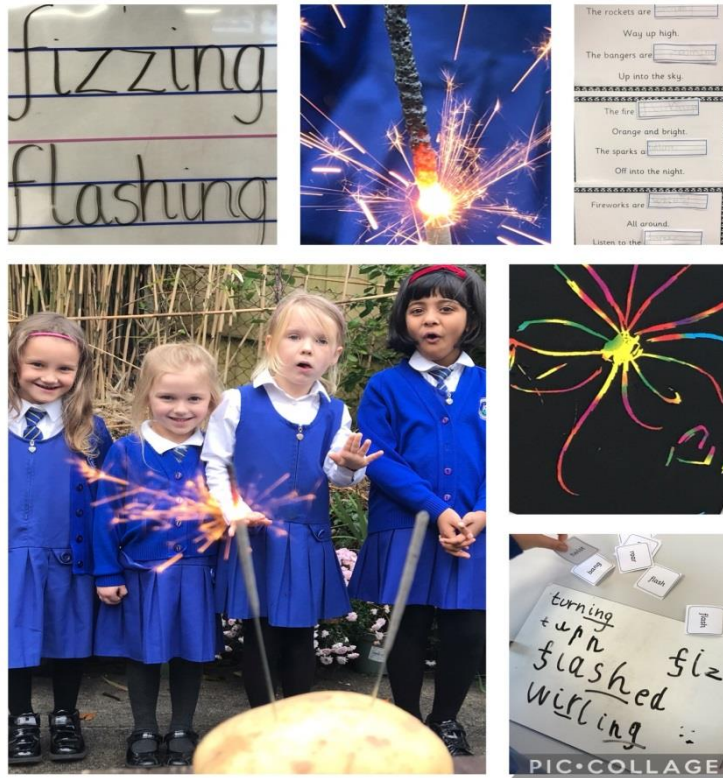

This has been a great opportunity to practise their subitising skills and use the words 'more' and 'fewer' to describe what they see.

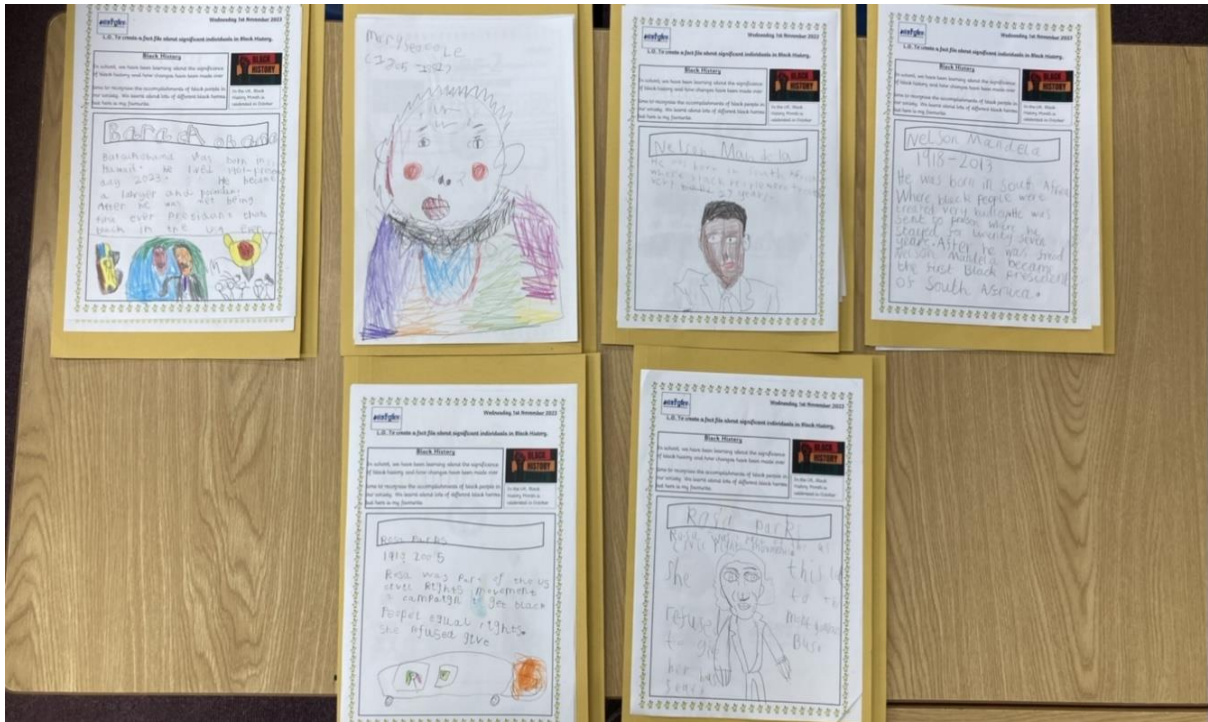

## Cornish Word of the Week

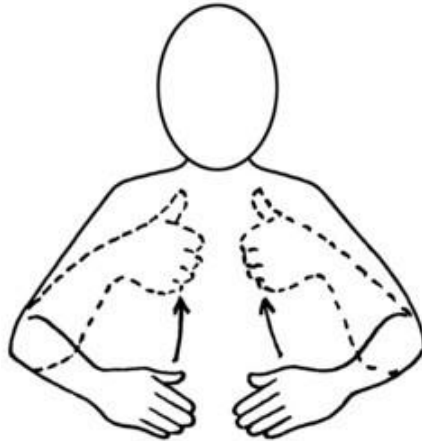
