

The children tried the coconut sweets and the mango lassi drink and watched a puppet show of the story of Rama and Sita. They also learned a dance together to finish off the celebrations. They finished the week by finding out about Remembrance Day, why we wear poppies and who we are remembering at this time. They worked collaboratively in their classes to create a piece of artwork which will take pride of place on the school grounds.



In Year 1 this week the children have started reading the book "Lost in the Toy Museum". Today they played hide and seek with their own class toys and made a post it note trail like "Bunting the cat" has to follow in the book. They've also been thinking about "Bunting's" character.

The children have also been using Purple Mash on the iPads. They've made their own avatars, coloured in pictures using paint tools and drawn their own pictures.



This week in Geevor, we have had a fantastic time in our music sessions and been taking turns to play the instruments in time with the beat of the song.


#### **Cornish Word of the Week**






























Year 1 Pop Up Toy Museum **Gwithti Gwariellow** Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> November


