
Cornish Word of the Week

As part of the Go Cornish Scheme, we are teaching everyone some Cornish words and phrases. Each week we will add a new word or phrase to the newsletter which you may like to use at home.

This week in the nursery we have been watching the BBC Children's remembrance film. Some children chose to recreate their own poppies using their creative skills. We have also been learning our new storytelling story 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children have been using the word 'enormous' during the week to describe a variety of things including the leaf pile we created and after finding the longest worm ever in the nursery garden! The children had a lot of fun jumping on the leaf pile and laying on top, burying their legs.



Reception have been using the book Junk DNA to inspire their maths this week. They have been using nuts and bolts to subitise and find amounts, circling what they see and using five frames to work out how many there are.

They also had their first Get Cycling and Life Skills sessions this week. In their Get Cycling session they learnt the importance of wearing a helmet, how to put one on and tighten it and how to stop the bike carefully. Our first Life Skills session focused on how they become more independent when finding and putting on their own jumpers and cardigans. The children learnt how to find theirs and

how to make sure the sleeves are the right way before putting it on. They showed great resilience and determination to succeed.



As part of World Science Day this week in year 2 one of our parents Mr. Buse came into school! He explained the science behind how Cormac keep our roads safe over the winter. We were lucky enough to be able to get up close and personal with a demonstration of how one of the 28 gritter lorrys look after the roads in Cornwall.

TOY MUSEUM POPS UP IN SCHOOL LUNCH HALL

First it was a lunch hall and fifteen minutes later it was a toy museum. The Year 1s are learning about toys so Miss Maun invited some jolly visitors from nearby museums to help expand their brains. They were looking at the materials as part of their Science and finding out about museums because they are reading the book 'Lost in the Toy Museum'.



Annie came from the Royal Cornwall Museum in Truro. She brought a yellow chest with some toys that were 80 years old. One of the most interesting toys was a doll with a head that had three faces. It had a sad face, a happy face and a sleepy face. The museum is open every day but not on Mondays. You can go there by car, train or bus.



Colin and Diana came from the Moseley Museum at Tolgus Mount. The toys were made out of metal and they are called Meccano. They buy the sets of Meccano and they read the instructions to build the trains. They brought a pinball machine called Pinball Wizard made out of Meccano. They can open anytime but you have to phone them first.

Vicky was from a Gwythy Orsek Teddy (Teddy Bear Museum) called Bear In Mine'd. She brought a Paddington made in the 1990s, a classic mini piano and a mini Winnie-the-Pooh. There was also a big teddy called Treasure and he was 100 years old. Also she had a scruffy brown Japanese bear which poured beer into a cup and sipped it! The museum is at King Edward Mine in Troon (TR14 9HW) and is open Wednesday to Sunday from 10am.
