Thank you to everyone who took part in the Magpie Trail yesterday. The children and parents had great fun going around and reading extracts from popular books and magpie-ing words from them. They added all the words to the magpie's nest and then used some of the words to write their own sentences. This is what we encourage all our children to do in their writing. If you find any interesting words in books at home or if they come up in conversation, please send them into school on a post it note for the children to add to their class magpie books.

The children have spent time visiting the local library, having visits from a local author and having time to share their favourite books as well as find new favourites. It has been wonderful to see so many children sharing their love of reading with others.



What a fantastic World Book Day! The children have enjoyed sharing their different books and having visitors from around the school in to read different stories. They have also been learning how to use the squidgy to clean the nursery garden windows and enjoying playing with gloop.



This week the reception children have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and using these to help them to draw and build their own engine house. They had to choose their shape carefully to make sure it replicated the engine house we visited. In our Wild Tribe session we have started to create a wildflower meadow in our playground space. The children were hard at work preparing the soil this week. In our Jigsaw PSHE lessons we have been learning about how exercise can help to keep our bodies healthy. The children took part in some energetic activities and then took time to feel how exercise had affected them.

We also walked to the local library during World Book Day, enjoying a story session and a chance to explore the books that are on offer there.



History Trip - This week we had a fantastic trip to Kresen Kernow and Redruth Library. We also had a super tour with Cobweb Tours and learnt all about how Redruth has changed over time. Class 9 – South Crofty	Aubrey for his incredible spelling. Well done.	Eli for always being a kind and caring friend to his peers.


Cornish Word of the Week
