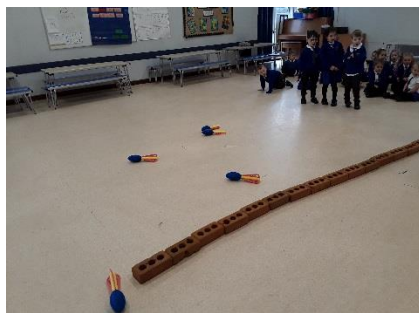

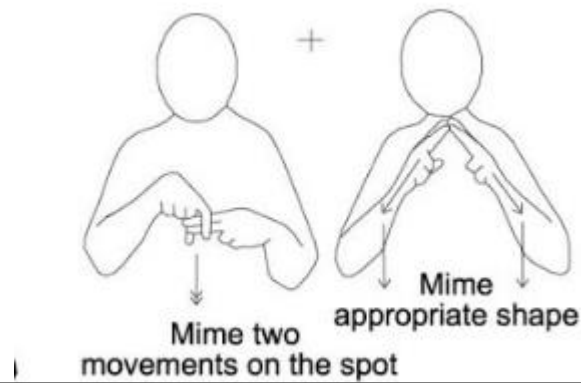
## Cornish Word of the Week
